This datasheet should be used in addition to the default datasheet in **January** and **August**. The objective is to monitor the deer herd on Spring Island. Give David a copy of your datasheet at the end of the month. ### Rules:

1. Camera should be deployed for the entire month (February and August)
2. Set camera at a height of 2-3 feet above the ground
3. Set delay on the camera to 5 minutes
4. Make sure time and date stamp are working
